<u>Robin Tolochko</u> – UW-Madison graduate student, uses social media to promote her work and personal business.

<u>Katie Kowalsky</u> – UW-Madison senior and Social Media Coordinator for a multi-national non-profit, is an avid user of social media for personal and professional reasons.

Both UW-Madison students navigated middle and high school with social media playing an active role. They will provide an overview of the most common platforms: Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, and discuss what type of visibility your child has if s/he is active on any of them. Additionally, Robin and Katie can speak to the social norms that have developed around these platforms (such as quantified popularity, now that you can compare how many "friends" or "likes" an individual has).

<u>Jack Maloney</u> – EAGLE School IT instructor and manager, will share best practices in internet security and his advice in teaching kids to use the internet wisely.

<u>Susan Findley</u> – EAGLE School guidance counselor, will address the ways in which parents can help their children navigate social pressure that is often exacerbated by social media use.

Congratulations to this year's State Science Olympiad team who took fourth place overall in last Saturday's competition. Every team member earned at least one medal!


