





Keep Students Safe

To help us keep all students safe at pick-up and drop-off times, we are asking all families to review the "Transportation and Parking Guidelines" in the family handbook. Here are some critical reminders:

- Do not leave your vehicle unattended in either traffic circle. If you need to leave your car, park it in a designated parking spot or along the street.
- In the traffic circles, pull as far forward as possible and stay to the right side of the road to allow space for vehicles to line up behind you and/or exit into the outer lane.
- Do not pick up or drop off your child from the outer (left) lane of the circles.
- Do not drop off your child until you are able to pull up to the sidewalk on the edge of the traffic circle. Allowing children to exit your vehicle early slows down the flow of traffic and creates an unsafe situation of children walking through the parking lot.
- If you are using a parking spot during drop-off or pick-up, please escort your child through the parking lot.
- Always use caution when backing up or pulling in/out of the parking lots.
- 8:15 to 8:25 AM is a high congestion time. Arriving prior to 8:15 will allow for a more efficient drop-off and help your child arrive to class on time.

Thank you for your care, courtesy, and willingness to protect our students in and around our building!



Winter Storm Policy

If school is closing or starting late due to inclement weather, you will be notified by our One Call Now messaging system via phone or email. (If you haven't taken the

necessary steps to modify or add to your contact information in the One Call Now system, please do so immediately. A link can be found on the EAGLE website.) A delayed start or school closing will also be posted on Channels 3, 15, and 27. Once school is open, we never close early. If you feel that weather conditions are dangerous, you may certainly come and take your child home. No need to call first, as it is important for us to have phone lines open for emergencies on bad weather days.
