Parents: Watch Mail for Effort & Behavior Reports

Early next week, you should receive your child's firstquarter Effort & Behavior Report via regular mail. In anticipation of parent-teacher conferences, this report will give you a snapshot of your child's behavior and ability to meet classroom expectations throughout the first guarter. Please review this report with your child and consider setting some specific second-quarter goals related to these areas. Questions or concerns may be discussed with teachers during conferences.

MAP Testing Begins November 2nd

November 2-24, our math and language arts teachers will be taking a few class periods to administer the standardized, computer-based MAP (Measure of Academic Progress) tests to students. We hope that all students will be in attendance during these weeks, feeling well-rested and prepared to do their best. Test results will be sent home with semester reports in January.
